Guidelines for presentations

Choose your presentation format carefully; each format comes with its own pros and cons, so focus on your own strengths. Below are the rules for each presentation type and guides on how to prepare your content.

Video

- > Videos should be no longer than 5 minutes.
- > The presenter (you) must face the camera at least once to introduce yourself.
- > Clarity of audio and images are a must
- Include credits and acknowledgements if needed.
- Upload your completed video as unlisted to your YouTube account, if you don't have an account, this is very easy to set up. Email the link to <u>smihdrconference@uq.edu.au</u> before 12:00 on 15 July (Australian Eastern Standard Time, UTC+10:00).
- > Any technical issues will be identified and participants will be given a week to fix them.
- > Shortlisted videos will be screened as part of the main conference proceedings.
- We may not be able to show all video submissions at the conference and may offer to link to them from the conference webpage after the event.
- Be aware of copyright laws around any music or images used in the video. There are a number of websites where you can source non copyright music and images.

Oral Presentation with slides

- > Presentations should be no longer than 5 minutes.
- Presentations should have a maximum of 8 slides.
- Questions related to the presentations will be answered during a Q&A session at the end of a set of 5 videos and presentations.
- Your PowerPoint file must be emailed to <u>smihdrconference@uq.edu.au</u> before 12:00 on 15 July (Australian Eastern Standard Time, UTC+10:00).

Interactive display

- You can present a 3D model, working prototype, or an interactive set of samples that explains your research.
- If your display involves the use of TV screens, a laptop or has any other electrical or technical requirements, you must inform the organising committee before 12:00 on 28 June (Australian Eastern Standard Time, UTC+10:00).
- > Be prepared to answer questions regarding the contents of your display by judges/fellow students.
- > The explanation of your display should be no longer than 5 minutes.
- Your interactive display will be shown in the foyer area with a rotating audience during the whole day of the conference.
- A brief email explaining the nature of your display (no more than 50 words) must be emailed to <u>smihdrconference@uq.edu.au</u> before 12:00 on 15 July (Australian Eastern Standard Time, UTC+10:00).



Scientific Poster

- > Prepare your poster in A2/A1 size displaying prominent information.
- > Please use as many images as possible, but do not overcrowd the poster.
- > Be prepared to answer questions regarding the contents of your poster by judges/fellow students.
- Posters will be displayed in the foyer area with a rotating audience during the whole day of the conference.
